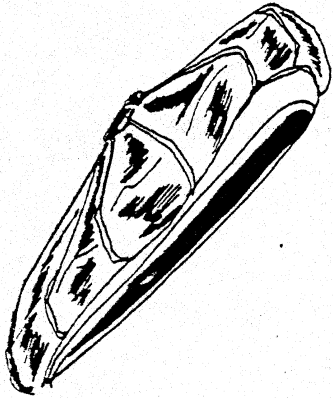

This issue, girls, we're going to talk of hair care, colour, style and shape.

WHY A PINK TRIANGLE?

In gay circles the Pink Triangle is becoming popular as a symbol. But as a symbol of what? As with most symbols and words used in the gay movement today, its origins lie not with gay people themselves, but originally was assigned to gays by heterosexuals. The pink triangle has greater significance because of its association with the extermination of the first gay movement of modern times.

By 1899 the world's first Gay Rights Organization, Wissenschaftlich-humanitares Komitee (Scientific Humanitarian Committee) had published 23 books in an effort to educate the public on homosexuality. The organization had been founded in 1897 by Adof Brand, Magnus Hirschfeld and Max Spohr, all members of the growing gay rights movement in Germany of the late 19th and early 20th century. This movement had started in 1871 when King Wilhelm set up the Second Reich and adopted the harsh Bavarian penal code which outlawed gay sex for the first time in 24 of the 35 previously independant states of Germany.

This gay rights movement was part of a large gay subculture in Berlin at the turn of the century. With a population of 2.5 million, Berlin supported 40 gay bars and according to police, nearly 2,000 hustlers. Many groups supported Gay Rights and in 1905 there were 320 publications on homosexuality. Groups such as the leftist Social Democratic Workingmen's Party had publicly supported gay rights. In 1928 the Reichstag Committee approved the Penal Reform Bill which abolished all homosexual crimes. This had been the goal of the German Gay Movement; however, before the law could take effect, the Nazis were swept into power by the economic chaos of 1929.

Hitler at first ignored the gays in his Nazi party. Ernst Rohm, head of the Brownshirt militia, was rather careless of his reputation. He and his cronies often met in Munich for orgies. Before Hitler held supreme power in Germany he said, "His (Rohm's) private life cannot be an object of scrutiny unless it conflicts with the basic principles of National Socialist ideology." It was only after 1933 when he held supreme power within the Third Reich that he decided that gay sex did conflict with his principles.

When Rohm's Brownshirts reached 500,000 men, Hitler tried to have the leaders assassinated. After this failed, he launched a year long campaign against 'decadence' in general. In his first year in power, prostitution was banned, all gay bars and hotels were closed, nudism and pornography were banned. Gay activists were arrested and sent to concentration camps; with the files and libraries of gay organizations destroyed by student terrorists. A law was passed requiring the sterilization of all homosexuals, schizophrenics, epileptics, drug addicts, hysterics, and those born blind or malformed.

On June 30, 1934, "The Night of Long Knives," Hitler finalized his campaign against gays in his government. Troops converged on a resort where Rohm had given a party the night before. Many were shot on the spot. Rohm was given a gun to commit suicide, but when he refused, he was shot. Hitler issued an order removing all gays from the army. Those who were not massacred, were sent to concentration camps. In the camps the gays were known by the pink triangle, 2 3/4 inches high, worn on the left side of the jacket and the right leg of the trousers. Gays were the lowest of the low, placed in level three camps, and put under "triple camp discipline"

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which meant more work and less food.

Rudolf Hoess, in his "Commandant of Auschwitz," reported some of the gay inmates, particularly the 'strichjungen', or the hustlers and the most obvious gays. It seems beatings had no effect. When Hoess was transferred to a new camp he found gays an 'epidemic.' They were assigned the worst work in the worst conditions. The idea behind all this was to make them normal again. However, very few gave up their gayness. Hoess reports, "Whenever they found the opportunity they would fall into one another's arms," and "knowing they would never be set free," they suffered additional psychological stress. Their work became harder and they died like flies. Hoess observed that even under these conditions the men formed deep lasting relationships, terminated on some occasions by the friends committing suicide together. However, as a whole the 'Strichjungen' did not give up. Hoess felt "It was often too easy to drive them to the gas chambers." Regardless of how hard it was to mass exterminate the gays, most estimates place the numbers killed close to half of a million.

The pink triangle as a symbol should remind gay people of those who have given up their jobs, who have lost the affection of family and friends, or who have suffered a greatly reduced lifestyle because of their gayness. Many have suffered even more and lost their lives simply because they were gay. As gay people we should wear the pink triangle to remind others that a half million gays wore it to their death in fascist Germany, people whose memory should not be forgotten.

The following is a letter that we received from one of our sisters that we hope will prove to interesting and helpful to you.

Dear Sisters;

This is the first open letter that I have written under my femme name. Thanks to you and to all the help and encouragement I have received from the issues of "Tams & Tissues".

After reading my first issue, I made some phone calls and set up a series of tight appointments. It was cold as I hurried out on the subway and I was glad I had nylons on under my thin femme slacks. Wearing broad heeled mens slack boots and with no make-up on I didn't look femme from the outside. It showed however, the state of my progress. I had been "closet dressing" for a long time but this was my first excursion outside for that length of time, even with my flowered blouse covered by the raincoat! Here I was, a young middle aged teenager! It was quite an experience!

I arrived at Paris Milan Wigs (7176 St. Hubert St) after making an appointment with "Suzanne"

It was a bit of a shock to find I had to shed my coat and sit in slacks and blouse in an open show room. I said to myself, "Here you go Rose-Marie, if you're out, you're out."!!!

My treatment could not have been kinder nor more professional! My wig was fitted in jig-time and I was bundling back into the refuge of my trench coat. She was happy to know that Tams was spreading the word and invited one and all to shop there.

Sentence cut for murderer of transsexual

A man who flew into a rage and stabbed his date to death after discovering "she" was a transsexual has had his eight-year sentence reduced to six years by the Ontario Court of Appeal.

In August, 1978, Richard William Andes, 20, picked up what he thought was a woman at a beach party. When they went to a nearby schoolyard, he discovered otherwise, exploded in anger, pulled a knife and stabbed Peter Christopher Hauser 17 times.

When Mr. Andes pleaded guilty to manslaughter last spring, police testified that Mr. Hauser, 23, was taking female hormones in preparation for a sex-change operation. He already had taken on some female characteristics and also was known as Shirley.

In a judgment released yesterday, the Appeal Court said there were a number of points that mitigated Mr. Andes' sentence, including his "homosexual panic," his good work record and the fact his only criminal conviction was for possession of marijuana.

Court hears transsexual's case

STRASBOURG, France — The European Court of Human Rights heard the case yesterday of Daniel van Oosterwijck, a Belgian transsexual who wants the law to recognize him as a man. Mr. van Oosterwijck, 35, a lawyer who lives in Brussels, says the Belgian Government's failure to change his birth certificate to reflect his changed sex violates his rights to privacy, marriage and freedom from degrading treatment, all guaranteed by the European Convention of Human Rights.

Sperm perk up with caffeine

Sperm swim twice as fast when they get a caffeine boost, according to an Israeli fertility expert quoted in Omni magazine.

Dr. Joseph Barkay of Central Emek Hospital in Afula, Israel, artificially inseminated 58 women with five parts semen to one part caffeine. There were 10 per cent more pregnancies in this group than in a control group.

Babies born to the women in the caffeine group were healthy and normal, the doctor said.

Partly due to the huge amount of warehousing of people the U.S. popularizes and the fact that many of the inmates who resided in the New Mexico State Prison were transfered to Colorado after the disasterous riot last winter. Girl the summers here are quite hot and I want to thankyou for caring about my health as it will stay good because I will not let the weather or these people get me down. Well sister i am going to write that article for you and hope that it will be of some help to others.

It is very hard in a prison for a transexual especially this one here. In Colorado, this being like a German Concentration Camp, in a lot of ways. First I would like to point out that being a T.S. in prison is really a bad trip, although I crossdress while in prison the staff along with the inmates (some of them) feel that if you crossdress you are a very sick individual and in need of some help. The prison refuses to give you hormone pills unless you can have a doctor on the streets write and tell these people that you are his patient and then you have to sign a release form that says you will release the prison from all liability. There is nothing that is more unbearable than to have not only verbal assaults but physical assaults by gaurds as well as inmates.

We T.S.'s stick pretty much together, as for the other inmates in here they act as if they have never seen a woman before and every one of them wants to try and get you to be there ol' lady. It is just a trip that is really hard to handle and that combined with all of these other problems is enough to make anyone have a nervous break-down. But this sister here takes it all in stride as a learning experience that will never be forgotten. So I will stay strong and wish for that day I'll get out and be able to live my life as a normal woman again.

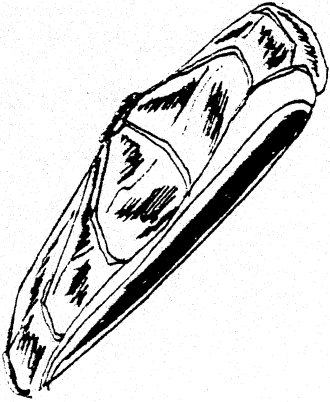
If you want to get in touch with someone before coming to a meeting, call David at 482-1926 between 5p.m. and 9 p.m. any day.
